
Maryland Strategic Prevention Framework (MSPF)



Maryland Strategic Prevention Framework-MSPF

- **July 1, 2009:** the Federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (**SAMHSA**) Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (**CSAP**) awarded the MD Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration (ADAA) \$2,135,724 per year for 5 years for a total of \$10.7 million to establish the Strategic Prevention Framework (MSPF)

SAMHSA's Strategic Prevention Framework



Maryland Strategic Prevention Framework-MSPF will operate through a partnership consisting of:

- Governor's Office
- MD State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council (DAAC)
- Maryland Alcohol & Drug Abuse Administration (ADAA)
- Center for Substance Abuse Research (CESAR)
- Local Drug and Alcohol Abuse Councils (LDAAC)



Maryland Strategic Prevention Framework-MSPF

- **Other Key Stakeholders**
 - CSAP Project Officer
 - 24 County/City Prevention Coordinators
 - Maryland Association of Prevention Professionals and Advocates (MAPPA)
 - Individuals representing communities and/or having interest/specific substance abuse expertise (to serve on the Advisory Committee & its workgroups)

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- **Maryland Alcohol & Drug Abuse Administration (ADAA):**
 - Lead agency for receipt and administration of MSPF funds
 - ADAA staff will be hired to:
 - Support MSPF implementation/continuation
 - Monitor progress
 - Comply w/federal reporting requirements

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- **Center for Substance Abuse Research (CESAR):**
 - Under contract with the ADAA
 - Will coordinate the State Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup (SEOW)
 - Will manage extensive analysis processes for defining scope and severity of ATOD consumption patterns and related consequences.

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- **Prevention Committee of the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council (DAAC):**
 - Designated as the MSPF Advisory Committee
 - Will provide ongoing guidance
 - Will implement 3 work groups responsible for accomplishing the required steps of the SPF

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MSPF Advisory Committee

■ **Mission:**

- To implement a comprehensive substance abuse prevention **planning** process,
- To build and **sustain** a cross-system prevention data **infrastructure**, and
- To expand state and local capacity for the provision of **effective** and **culturally competent** substance abuse **prevention** services across the **lifespan**.

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MSPF Advisory Committee

Purpose: SAMHSA's overarching goals for the project are to:

- 1) Prevent the onset and reduce the progression of substance abuse, including childhood and underage drinking;
- 2) Reduce substance abuse-related problems; and
- 3) Build prevention capacity and infrastructure at the State-and community-levels.

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Three (3) Advisory Committee Workgroups

(1) State Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup-SEOW:

- Develop state-of-the-art empirically-based **monitoring system** for alcohol, tobacco, and other drug consumption and consequences indicators;
- Conduct **needs assessments** to identify **service gaps** and **priority needs**;
- Identify underserved **geographic areas and target populations** by performing **epidemiological analyses** and **GIS mapping**;
- Measure **progress and outcomes**;
- Collect, interpret, and disseminate data through a variety of **reports**.

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Three (3) Advisory Committee Workgroups

(2) Evidence-Based Program (EBP) Implementation Workgroup—


- Prepare **inventory** of existing EBPs at the State and national level;
- Develop and/or approve **policies, programs, practices and sub-recipient prevention plans**,
 - In accordance with CSAP's "*Identifying and Selecting Evidence-Based Interventions*" document and other CSAP guidance.

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Three (3) Advisory Committee Workgroups

(3) Cultural Competence Workgroup

- Ensure that culture, disability, age, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, language, and gender competence issues are addressed
 - In accordance with SAMHSA's "Guidelines for Assessing Cultural Competence" document and other CSAP guidance.
- Evaluate sub-recipient proposals for:
 - Cultural competence,
 - Appropriate language and literacy levels, and
 - Racial/ethnic representation.





MSPFAC Goal and Tasks

Goal #1: Develop a comprehensive, cross-system statewide strategic PLAN by April 2010.

- Utilize CSAP's *Guidance for Developing the SPF-SIG Plan*;
- Assess statewide **resource needs and gaps**;
- Incorporate statewide **workforce needs assessment** and development plan;
- Maximize state agencies' **fiscal resources** for substance abuse prevention;

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MSPFAC Goal and Tasks

Goal #1: Develop a comprehensive, cross-system statewide strategic PLAN by April 2010. (cont'd)

- **Align prevention funding** with the SEOW needs assessment data;
- **Make recommendations** for deploying SPF-SIG resources to local communities via Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for MSPF Special Initiatives;
- Infuse **at least 85% of SPF-SIG** funding into prevention services at the community level over the 5 years of SPF funding.

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MSPFAC Goal & Tasks

Goal #2: Collect & utilize statewide SEOW needs assessment DATA, including tobacco access/control data, for prevention planning at the ADAA and jurisdictional levels.

- **Assess** and **prioritize** risk factors/resource needs for underage drinking;
- **Analyze** SEOW consequence indicators (demographic breakdowns/target populations);
- Assess and perform GIS mapping of **resources** for the provision of prevention services;
- Assess needs/resources for **veterans** and other **special populations**.

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MSPFAC Goal and Tasks

Goal #3: Determine targeted population OUTCOMES for ADAA & jurisdictions utilizing SEOW-collected data.

- Review data collection tools, translate them into appropriate languages to ensure cultural sensitivity, and ensure that needs assessments and outcome evaluations **represent diverse populations**;
- Identify community and state **outcome measures** for underage drinking;
- Identify and assess target population outcomes and prepare **community/county profiles**;
- Identify and assess substance-related risk indicators and outcomes measures for returning **military veterans** at risk of post-traumatic stress, traumatic brain injuries and related disorders.

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MSPFAC Goal and Tasks

Goal # 4: Expand CAPACITY to address specific prevention needs in jurisdictions.

- Provide **regional trainings** in SPF principles/steps, cultural competence, evidence-based practices (EBPs), and special initiatives for vulnerable populations;
- Promote **local SPF stakeholder activities** and needs assessment/planning processes;
- Coordinate/utilize **cross-system resources** to address specific needs identified;
- Implement **culturally competent & evidence-based** programs/policies/practices.

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MSPFAC Goal and Tasks

Goal #5: Measure/document population-level IMPACT at State- and jurisdictional-levels.

- Develop **protocols** for sub-recipient data collection and evaluation;
- Maintain **management information system (MIS)** for SPF evaluation data;
- **Monitor fidelity** of implementation of evidence-based programs;
- **Prepare annual state profile** of survey results and assessed population-level changes in consumption and consequence indicators.

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MSPFAC Goal and Tasks

Goal #6: Develop State- and jurisdictional-level prevention services INFRASTRUCTURE.

- Widely disseminate **Statewide SPF Strategic Plan**;
- **Evaluate effectiveness** of prevention services and conformance to SPF principles/steps;
- Measure **performance** and implement **performance-based funding decisions**;
- Increase the numbers of other State- and local- agencies that utilize **SPF methodology** for allocating resources based on epidemiological data;
- Achieve **SPF sustainability** by transitioning SEOW contract and key project staff positions to the SAPT-BG prevention set-aside over the 5 year course of the project.

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MSPF Advisory Committee

- **Advisory Committee:**
 - Delegate Reznik & Suzan Swanton will Co-Chair;
 - Will meet every other month;
 - Provide status reports on MSPF to the DAAC.
- **Each Workgroup:**
 - Will have a chairperson and an ADAA staff person;
 - Meet monthly;
 - Provide progress reports on goals and tasks to MSPFAC.
